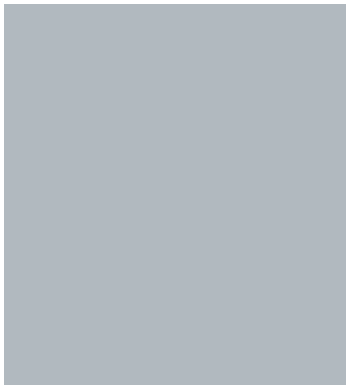

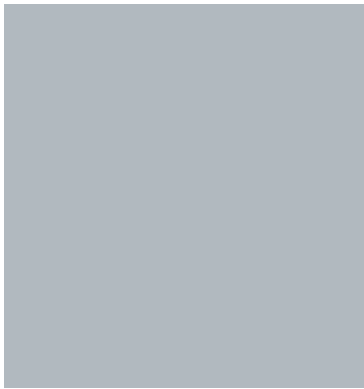

The College of Central Florida is a public institution accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools. Florida's higher education system is designed to allow students to successfully pursue a bachelor's degree by first attending a community college and then transferring to a four-year university. The state of Florida guarantees that students who complete an A.A. degree at a community college have the opportunity to enroll in and earn a bachelor's degree at a state university. Students who earn an A.A. degree at CF are guaranteed general admission into at least one of Florida's 11 public universities.

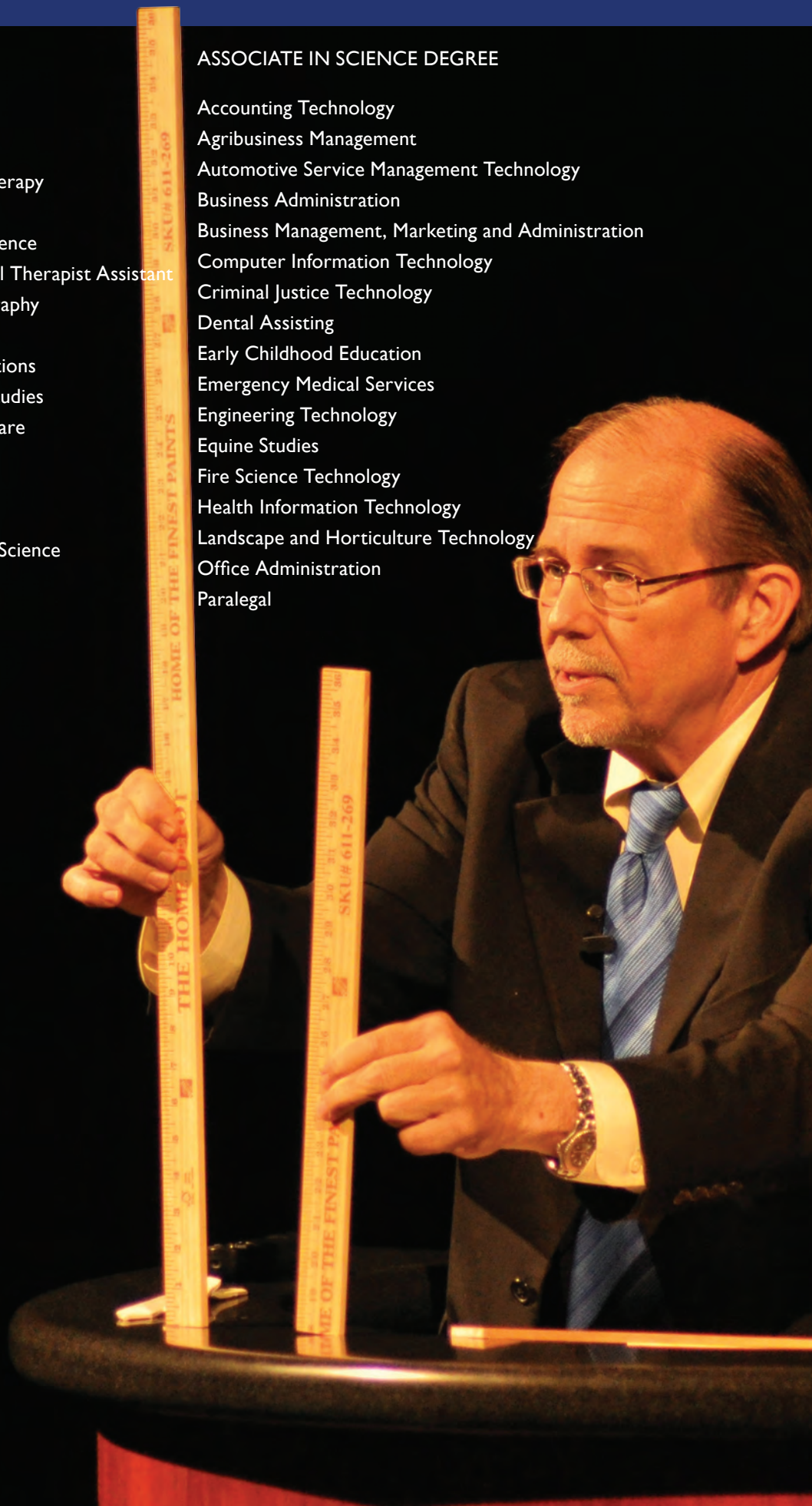

ENGLISH AS A SECOND LANGUAGE



CF offers English language courses as an integral part of your academic degree program. We accept students at all English fluency levels and have courses designed to assist you with improving your English language skills in order to be successful in college-level courses. CF advisors will work with you to ensure that you are taking the courses appropriate for your level and receive the education you need in order to be successful.

You will take a placement exam upon arrival to CF in order to determine your English and math skill level. Based on the results of the placement test, students who are not ready for college-level courses will be placed in English for Academic Purposes (EAP) or other preparatory courses. CF accepts TOEFL (61), IELTS (5.5) and STEP/EIKEN (2A) test scores, but they are not required. If you have the following scores, you will not be required to take the English portion of the placement test, but you will take the math section. CF's EAP program offers two levels of instruction in three skill areas: reading, writing and grammar, and speech and listening.

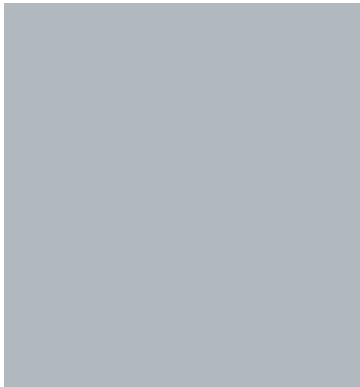
Tuition at the College of Central Florida costs less than half of what you will pay to attend a public university and a third of what you will pay to attend a private university.

1. Apply online

Go to www.CFedu and click “Apply Now” and then click “International Student.” There is a \$30 application fee at the end of the application. After you complete the application, you will receive an email with your student ID number.

2. Have your high school diploma and transcripts evaluated

You must have your high school diploma and transcripts evaluated and sent to CF. Send your documents to one of the following evaluation agencies for a “document by document evaluation.” If your documents are not in English, you will also need to have an official English translation. The cost of the evaluation and translation are your responsibility. If you graduated high school in the United States, you may send your documents directly to CF and are not required to have your documents evaluated.

3. Send your financial documents

You must submit evidence of financial responsibility and have sufficient funds to pay tuition and fees, textbook cost, medical and living expenses, and health insurance. You must complete the Confidential Financial Statement Form and Financial Support Information Form, which can be found at www.cf.edu/international.

4. Send a copy of your passport

Email a photocopy of your passport to international@cf.edu. Include your CF student ID number in your email.

Once you have completed the requirements below, please allow approximately one week for your application to be processed. Once you are accepted to CF, you will receive a Form I-20 and instructions on how to apply for an F-1 student visa through the U.S. Embassy in your country.

APPLICATION DEADLINES

Although CF accepts international student applications year-round, the following deadlines must be followed in order to ensure that your application is processed and you receive your admission packet on time.

- Spring – November 15
- Summer A – April 1
- Summer B – May 1
- Fall – July 1

SEMESTER START DATES

- Fall - August
- Spring - January
- Summer - May
