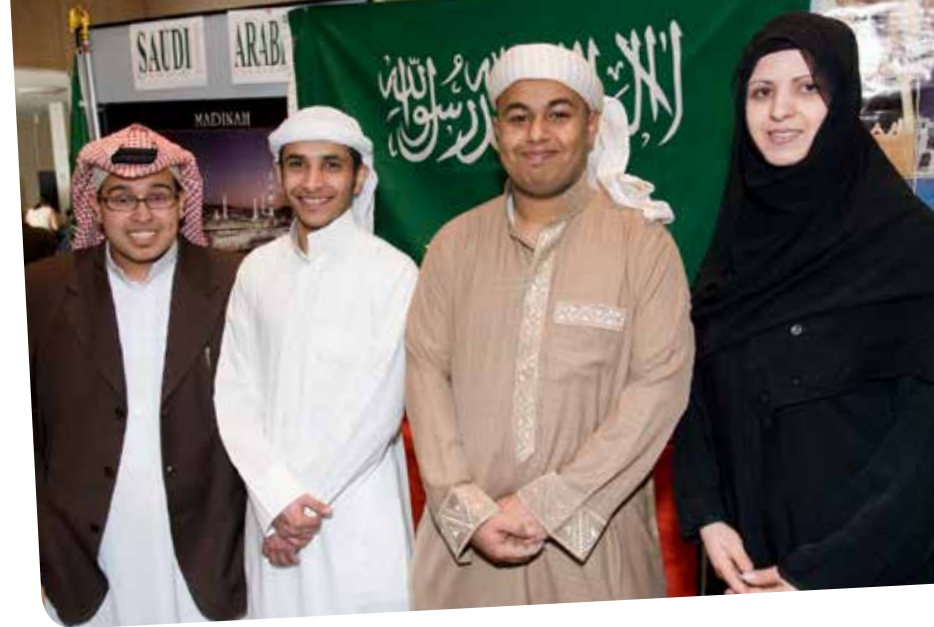
## Residence Hall Life

In 2012 Outside Magazine online recommended UI as one of the 25 universities where students can hit the books and the back country.

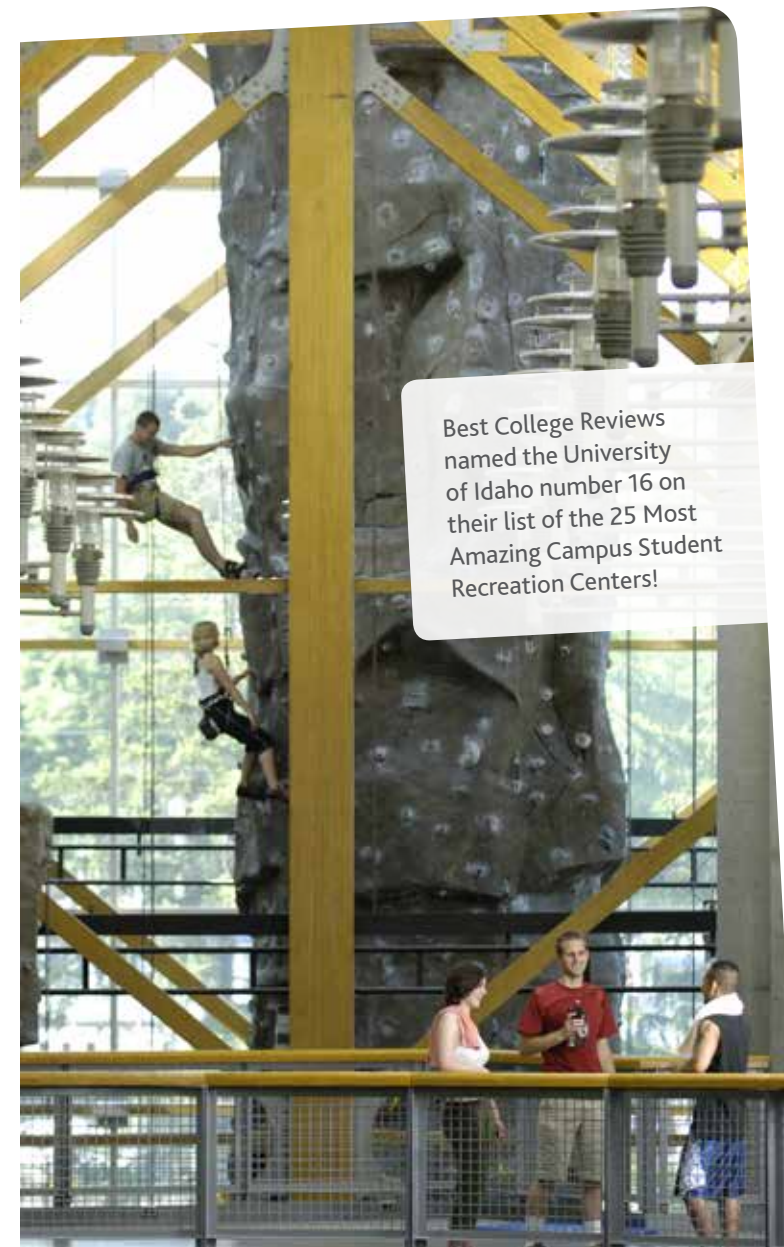
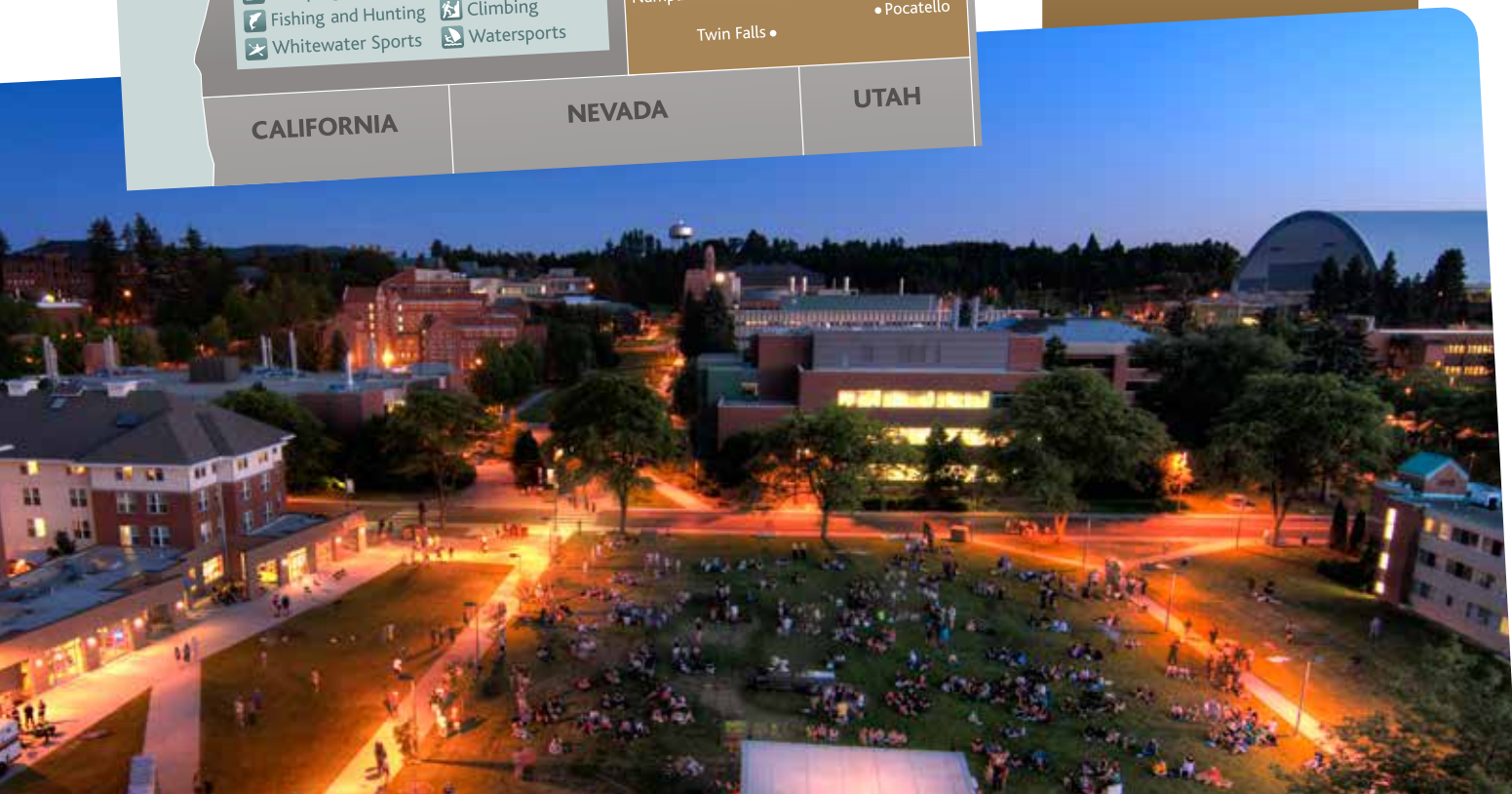

# How Do I Apply?

## Academic Requirements

A 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 GPA scale is required from secondary school. Students must meet criteria for admission to university level study in home country. Engineering majors must have a 2.8 GPA

## International Student Language Requirements

Meeting any one of the following scores is acceptable as proof of English competency for students whom English is not their primary language.

Students who do not meet our language requirements may be offered **Conditional Admission** and must enroll in our **American Language and Culture Program (ALCP)**.

## Steps to Apply

1. Select your major
2. Make sure your academic performance and test scores meet the minimum admission requirements for first-year students
3. Complete the international application for admission
4. Pay the \$70 application fee
5. Receive acceptance and I-20

## Upon Acceptance

6. Apply for student visa at US Embassy or Consulate
7. Reserve housing
8. Contact academic advisor and register for classes
9. Complete Pre-Arrival checklist for International Student Orientation
10. Arrive on campus for New International Student Orientation

## How to Officially Transfer Your Credits

1. Submit an application for admission, a \$70 application fee and official transcripts from all colleges and universities attended to the Office of Admissions.
2. If you transfer at least 14 semester credits or 21 quarter credits, high school transcripts and test scores are not required.
3. You must have a cumulative transfer GPA of at least 2.0 to be considered for admission at Idaho. Engineering programs require a 2.8 GPA.
4. A credit evaluation will be required for all credit being transferred from a foreign college or university. Our Registrar's Office will evaluate all coursework from schools located within the United States.

# Costs and Scholarships

The cost of an education at the University of Idaho is an exceptional value.

## Scholarship Opportunities for International Students!

The University of Idaho offers two excellent scholarships to international students pursuing a bachelor's degree. No additional application is necessary. Simply fill out an International Student Application for Admissions and submit all supporting documents!

### Discover Idaho International Tuition Waiver

To qualify for this scholarship, you must have either a high school or college transfer GPA of at least a 3.25. There are two categories:

**3.25-3.59 GPA: \$1,500 Tuition Waiver**

**3.6-4.0 GPA: \$3,500 Tuition Waiver**

This scholarship is renewable if a minimum cumulative GPA is maintained.

### International Diversity Tuition Waivers

Students must have a 3.0 GPA and be pursuing a bachelor's degree to be eligible. Award amount is \$6,500 per year, renewable for up to 4 years. Preference given to underrepresented student populations.

# American Language and Culture Program (ALCP)

The mission of the American Language and Culture Program (ALCP) is to provide non-native speakers of English with the linguistic, academic, social, and cultural skills necessary to successfully navigate university environments in the United States.

The ALCP promotes internationalization at the University of Idaho and encourages respect for linguistic and cultural diversity on the campus and in the community.
